



Man charged after burglary and chase.(News)

A man shot by a Brockton detective after a car chase to neighboring Whitman Sunday night was ordered held on \$100,000 bail yesterday after pleading innocent to a list of charges.

Richard Smith, 35, of Brockton, was treated for a minor arm wound after being shot by Detective Ken Williams on Highland Avenue in Whitman about 11:30 p.m. after Smith and another man were chased there from a burglary at Alexander's Restaurant in Brockton.

Brockton police Lt. William Conlon said Smith tried to run over Williams in a bid to escape the dead-end street.

"He's not a stranger to the officers here," Conlon said of Smith, who was arraigned in Brockton District Court on charges of assault and battery with a dangerous weapon, assault with a dangerous weapon, breaking and entering in the nighttime and multiple motor vehicle offenses.
